

# 2021 Preaching Calendar

#### ANNUAL SERMON RHYTHM

Starting in 2021, there is a new over-arching annual rhythm guiding our sermon series. Each year will include three 10-week series in a Gospel (spring), in the Old Testament (summer), and in a New Testament Epistle (fall) respectively. There will be four 4-week series, starting with a Reimagine series every January that rallies us as a church, a breath out series every May that sends us as a church, a breath in series every August that grows us as a church, and our Advent series in December that focuses us on the coming of Jesus. In the gaps, there will be a sprinkling of standalone sermons to preach on needed issues.

## 2021 SERMON SERIES: MAY – DECEMBER

### Conversations with Jesus // May 2-23

In this breathe out series, we are examining four of Jesus' conversations with non-Christians in the Gospels. We will study them in such a way to infuse the evangelistic heartbeat and pattern of Jesus into the fabric of our church.

### One Story, One Hero // May 30-August 1

This series will teach a Christ-centered understanding of the Old Testament by looking at 10 wellknown stories in the Old Testament and show how the hero of each story points to Jesus in a greater way, and as the true Hero of the Bible.

### Teach Us To Pray // August 8-29

As a country in a new era because of a pandemic, and our church with new dreams because of Reimagine, it is fitting to increase our prayer life individually and collectively as a church. In this four-week breathe in series, we will do this by looking at the teaching of Jesus on prayer to his disciples in Matthew 6.

# 10 Sentences To Change Your Life // September 19-November 28

This series will show the life-giving and life-shaping power of the gospel by going through 10 verses (sentences) in Romans. The hope is to help people understand the gospel in clear ways, experience the power of the gospel in real ways, and respond to the power of the gospel in practical ways.

### Advent // December 5-26

As unbelievable as it may be, no one – regardless of his or her story – is outside the hope of the gospel of Jesus Christ. This series will showcase the inclusively diverse gifts of the gospel by looking at four women who are – unexpectedly – included in the genealogy of Jesus in Matthew 1.

# PHILIPPIANS STUDY FOR CIRCLES

In this five-week study, we will dig into Paul's letter to the Philippians through videos, group discussion, and daily personal devotions.

# Curriculum Sample

## **DAY 6**:

Pause – Take a moment to slow down, be still, and pray.

#### Read Philippians 1:15-18

<sup>15</sup> Some indeed preach Christ from envy and rivalry, but others from good will. <sup>16</sup> The latter do it out of love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel. <sup>17</sup> The former proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely but thinking to afflict me in my imprisonment. <sup>18</sup> What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed, and in that I rejoice.

# Notice:

- The negative take of those preaching the gospel.
- "From envy and rivalry" (v. 16)
- "From selfish ambition" (v. 17)
- "To afflict Paul" (v. 17)
- The positive assessment of Paul: "Christ is proclaimed, and in that I rejoice."

### Don't Miss:

More than the messenger, Paul is rejoicing in the message. For Paul, his joy is not in who is doing the preaching but of whom they are preaching. His joy is in Christ proclaimed. Which says something about what gives Paul joy. Also, it says something about the power of the gospel, in that the message of Jesus is greater than the messenger. The impact, ultimately, of the gospel is not under the control of one person's character, but in the hands of the good and gracious plan of our God.

# Personalize:

What sort of joy do you get from others preaching Christ? Take a minute to jot down why that brought Paul joy and why it can bring you joy too.

### Pray:

Pray for CCC, the Orchard church plants, and every other church you know proclaiming the message of Jesus today.

For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God. Ephesians 2:8 (ESV)

Jesus is central to everything we do as we help kids connect that they can be a part of Building God's Kingdom - one connection at a time. All week, we will help teach kids that God is their rescuer! Kids will learn that they need a rescuer, Jesus can rescue them, Jesus helps them grow and Jesus gives us a mission. By studying the life of Paul in the book of Acts and 2 Corinthians, kids will see that it is "by grace you have been saved by faith and this is not your own doing, but it is the gift from God" (Ephesians 2:8).
