Main Points: Initial Thought/Reactions/Comments

Reflect – Questions

- 1. **The checkered past of Christianity.** What have you heard about Christianity or Christians that doesn't make Jesus Famous but Infamous?
- 2. **The Problem.** Read Galatians 3:28 and Colossians 3:11. How have Christians struggled to live out those verses? Why do you think that it is? When you hear about the history of slavery and racism in our country (like the 3/5 principle), how do you process and to react to it?
- 3. It is so easy to reduce the value of others (3/5ths) so that we can feel better about ourselves. Who are some "types" of people you are most likely to put in a bucket, like Joe referenced, and see as less than yourself? Who are your "Us vs. Them"? Give your group a chance to reflect personally before sharing.
- 4. **The Lesson. Read John 1:3-4.** What is the lesson of Jonah, and how does that hit you? How do you see yourself getting in the same boat?
- 5. **The Shepherd. Read John 10:11-15.** Like a sheep to the Good Shepherd, two things happen: grace comes to us, and grace flows from us. How does the grace Jesus gives change the way we see, treat, and love those different from us? How well do you do this?

- 1. **The 21-Day Prayer Initiative.** We are starting 21-day church initiative called Unified. Pick up a copy at church, or you can find it online as well.
- 2. **Infamous or Famous challenge** pursue someone who is different from you and show them hospitality and grace this month. Drop off your card in the offering.
