Great Question – If God is real and loves us, why doesn't he make himself more obvious?

Review

Main Points

Ask the group: What were your initial thoughts, reactions, and comments?

- 1. The problem with obvious
- 2. The solution to obvious
- 3. What happens when God becomes obvious?

Reflect

- 1. **Is God obvious?** Read John 20:30-31. What things come to your mind that give you confidence that God exists?
- 2. Seeing the fullness of God. Read Exodus 33:17-23. What does this passage reveal to us about God and the fullness of His glory? How does this help explain why God might not make Himself obvious in the world in the ways we desire?
- 3. God makes Himself known. Read John 1:1-5, 14, and 18. Often when we think about God making Himself known, we overlook what is right in front of us. What does this passage teach us about Jesus, who He is, and how He has made God known?
- 4. **Consequence of obvious. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17.** What does this passage say is the impact of a relationship with God? How does this change make God obvious to the world and how can we use it to make Jesus famous?

Respond

How can you use your story of coming to faith in Jesus to make Jesus famous? Maybe what your unbelieving co-workers or friends need to see and hear is how you have been radically changed because of your relationship with Jesus.

- Consider taking the step of writing out your testimony. Practice sharing your story, so you can share it in a few minutes to a friend.
- Consider the act of Baptism as a public declaration of your faith in Jesus.
