Reflect – Questions

1. **Home.** What comes to mind when you hear the word home? How would you define home and what reminds you of home?
2. **The search for home. Read John 14:1-6.** Why do you think Jesus' response to his disciple's fear and worry is to tell them that God has many rooms for them in heaven? How does the context help us better understand John 14:1-6? (Look at John 13:21-38)
3. Describe a time of restlessness or anxiety of not being home. What is that like, and what do you do in those circumstances?
4. **Read John 14:5-6. How do we get home?** Thomas asks a very important question in verse 5, and Jesus provides an important answer. What are other ways we look to get home instead of Jesus? Why is Jesus the only way?
5. **The promise of home. Read John 17:22-23.** How do these verses strike you? When comparing them to John 14:1-6, how do these verses help us better understand the concept of home, given to us through Jesus?

Respond

1. Jesus's response to his disciple's fear and worry is a reminder of what is to come. The promise of a home in God's presence. The troubles of today will pale in comparison to the joy of eternity. What can you do to remember to have an eternal perspective and hope in times of trouble?
2. The exclusivity of John 14:6 is difficult for a lot of people who are not followers of Jesus to understand. Why is this verse actually good news and how can we share this good news of an eternal home with our unbelieving friends and acquaintances?
