Reflect – Questions

- 1. The amount of love you give is directly connected to the amount of love you receive. How have you seen that play out in your life?
- 2. Bad things can be used for good (Romans 8:28).
 - What is the only "because" that matters when we face the choice of loving others? (see John 13:34 & 15:12-13)
 - How do we often misinterpret Romans 8:28?
 - Describe a time when you sensed that God was with you (like Joseph) as you chose to trust God's love during a hard time. What "good" did that "bad" thing produce in you?
- 3. Truly good things will never be lost (Romans 8:31-32 with Luke 15).
 - When you think of God being for you, what comes to mind?
 - Read the story of the Prodigal Son in Luke 15. Describe what the Father is like and what sticks out to you the most?
- 4. The best things are yet to come (Romans 8:29-30).
 - Think about the Greek word, *paligenesia*—the miracle of all things being restored to their original design and intent. What things do you sense God wanting to restore in you?
 - What do you imagine the "Jesus You" would be like?
