Review

Main Points:

Initial comments, questions, and reactions about the sermon?

1. Where does their fear come from?
2. How does their fear go away?
3. What turns their fear into peace and joy?

Reflect

Questions:

1. Two questions: what's the strangest fear you have, and what's the strongest fear you have? What makes you afraid of that, you think?
2. **Read Genesis 3:6-10.** What made Adam and Eve afraid? Have you had a time where you were genuinely afraid of God?
3. **Read Luke 2:16-20.** How does Jesus remove the fear of the shepherds?
4. **As you look at what you are afraid of, how does the gospel speak into your fears?** Go around the group and take one fear to reflect on each. Don't be afraid to take a lot of time on this question?

Respond

Read Luke 2:20. There is a completely different picture of the shepherds. Do you believe in Jesus as your Savior and Lord like the shepherds? When was the last time you responded to God like that, and why?

Pray

Go around as a group and ask for prayer requests. Pray as a group together.
